

What Do You Mean "Its Gone?"

An interview with Club Member Harold Moody

Harold and Mary Moody have had a couple of car-related experiences that few of our members ever have. First of all, a little about this couple. The Moody's have been members of our car club since 1995. Harold retired from the grocery business after forty years of work starting as a box boy in a grocery store and working his way up to a regional manager for Raleys. He met Mary while managing a Bel Air market store in Sacramento and they soon married. Both Harold and Mary subsequently went to work for Raleys Markets. Harold was transferred to Reno in 1987 to become the district manager for Raleys and the couple decided that Reno would be a nice place to retire to. So it was. The Moodys have four children, seven grandchildren and five great grandchildren.

The Moodys have been very active members of our Club. They attend almost every RMCC meeting and you will see their faces at most Club shows and events. Over the years Harold has often been called upon for car show judging, and has served as Sergeant at Arms, show parking manager, and Publicity Chairman. Mary has been Historian and very active with the car show raffles.

In his younger years, Harold owned a 1967 Mustang coupe. After many tickets, he decided that it was time to get rid of it. The Moody's are now the proud owners of an all original '66 Mustang convertible. They purchased the car at a Silver's Auction at Hot August Nights in August of 1994. The car is painted Springtime Yellow with black interior, 289 V8 engine, automatic transmission, power top, and the original AM radio (which still works). In 2004 Harold turned to Dave Thompson, one of our Club's seasoned "motorheads," to rebuild the engine and rework the front end. Like many of our members, Harold has called upon the mechanical skills of Ron Wheeler and his crew at RDW Automotive for small repairs and maintenance over the years.





Now, about those experiences. First of all, the Moody's cherished '66 Mustang convertible was stolen. Coming home from work one day in August, 1995 they opened their garage door to find the Mustang missing. Further inspection revealed that they had also been robbed of many other "quickgrab" possessions. They reported the robbery to the police, fully expecting to never see or hear of their Mustang again. As Harold put it, he thought the car was on a ship headed for Japan! Much to everyone's surprise, the car was found abandoned in Minden twelve days later. It was dirty, out of gas, and had a dead battery. The Moody's would later learn that the Mustang had been stolen by a couple of young people who used it for a lengthy joy ride around the area. Fortunately, with the exception of a front-end that was knocked out of alignment and damaged speakers, the car received no significant damage.

The second unusual experience shared with me was the opportunity to meet Carroll Shelby. In November, 2002 a local charity group contacted the RMCC to inform them that they were conducting a charity chili event at the annual Reno Chili Cook-off and desired a few Mustangs from the club to appear as a backdrop because Carroll Shelby was attending. Harold was one of the members who responded to the request and came home with a picture of him with Mr. Shelby and a signed autograph on the glove box door of his Mustang.





Today the Moodys remain as one of our Club's most active members. In addition to participating in Club activities, they enjoy ocean boating and fishing in their 20 foot boat, traveling in their motor home, and performing volunteer work – Harold with SAVE (Senior Auxiliary Volunteer Effort), a volunteer organization of the Reno Police Department, and Mary with the Reno Assistance League benefiting children and seniors in need in the area. Their association with the RMCC has brought them many years of enjoyment meeting with other car enthusiasts, attending car shows and events, and the fellowship of friends – new and old.

Say It's Not True . . .

To support my role as Editor of Mustang Tales, Judi and I are constantly looking for Mustang/Ford information that would be interesting to our members. In addition to reviewing most of the major car magazines in publication, we also scan the Internet for items of interest – Judi does most of this work. Recently we came across a piece that may be very troubling to many of you. According to the Internet site "Horsepower Kings.com" Ford is preparing to discontinue their V8 engine beginning in 2017. That's right, no more V8s in the future. The Internet publication claims that Ford is bowing to the pressure of the EPA to introduce vehicles that meet the federal CAFÉ (Corporate Average Fuel Economy) standards and manufacture more fuel-efficient cars.

We all know what the EPA is and are familiar with its relentless drive for cleaner air in this country. The Feds introduced the CAFÉ standards in the auto industry in support of this goal. The CAFÉ standards require the auto manufactures to meet an average fuel economy standard of 39 miles per gallon for cars, and 30 miles per gallon for trucks by 2017. The auto manufactures plan to meet this goal by building smaller, more fuel efficient vehicles; reducing the weight of its current models (i.e. aluminum alloy components on the 2015 Ford F150 pickup); and improving the fuel efficiency of the engines in its current models. According to Horsepower, it looks like part of Ford's strategy to achieve the standards is to stop equipping its new models with V8 engines: http://horsepowerkings.com/sources-ford-to-discontinue-v8-engines-in-mustang-f150-after-2018/

I should point out that the elimination of the Ford V8 engine appears to be a strong rumor at this point in time. In conducting an Internet search looking for sources to collaborate the Horsepower Kings.com article, all I could find was blogs discussing the issue. Recently Dianna Wheeler found a post that indicates that Ford has no intent to discontinue the V8 http://www.carscoops.com/2015/01/ford-official-we-will-not-drop-v8-from.html. What's the truth? I'll let you review these posts and decide for yourself. If this rumor proves to be correct and you want a new, V8-powered Mustang in your garage, you may want to buy it soon!


Membership Notes

I would like to take a moment to explain our points system to members new and old. Our Participation Points are awarded for any participation by members in various club and non club related activities throughout the year. The end result for the member with the most Participation Points is the presentation of a plaque engraved with the members name that they keep for display for a year along with free membership for the following year. Points are awarded for participation regardless of whether events are RMCC or other events. For example, if you attend a RMCC club activity such as our Automobile Museum Wax and Shine, you would receive 10 points. If you attend Battle Born Mopars Car Show at Deer Park, you would receive 20 points for participation in a judged show. It does not matter if a show or event is designated as an RMCC activity or not, you will still receive points for participation. The idea is for the RMCC club members to be out there having fun and representing our club while simply doing the things they love to do. Points are also awarded

for serving on committees, writing an article for the monthly newsletter, as well as bringing in new members and donating raffle prizes. When in doubt write it on the sheet and you will most likely be awarded points. You may also nominate others for points if you feel they have done something to earn them.

The way we know what you have done each month is by putting it on the sign in sheet at the monthly meetings. If you are unable to attend the meetings, please send me an e-mail or keep a list and make certain to get it to me no later than November of that year with a list of all your activities. 
