## Eleanor Sold at Auction

The May, 2013 issue of *Mustang Tales*, published an article concerning the upcoming auction of the original Eleanor Mustang used in the Nicholas Cage movie “Gone in Sixty Seconds.” The 1967 Mustang is one of eleven Mustang fastbacks created for the movie, but only three of the cars were actually working Mustangs. The Eleanor Mustang up for auction was the “beauty car” used for most close-ups and promotional efforts and considered the original Eleanor. According to the Fox News Web site, the Eleanor Mustang was successfully auctioned at the Mecum Spring Classic auction for the sum of *one million dollars*.



The Eleanor Mustang is not an original Shelby, but rather a customized '67 fastback built by Cinema Vehicle Services with the help of legendary coach builder Chip Foose. For those of you who wanted to purchase the Eleanor Mustang and are devastated by the news of the sale, you can still have an Eleanor of your own. The folks at Classic Recreations can custom build one for you using a '67 Mustang fastback shell.

## Mustang Honored on Postage Stamp



For those of you who still use the U.S. Postal Service for your mail, you can now purchase a stamp that features the 1967 Shelby GT500 Mustang. The stamp was created to honor Carol

Shelby. The stamp comes included with a bundle of stamps known as the “Muscle Car Bundle” and is available at U.S. post offices or on the USPS Web site at [www.usps.com](http://www.usps.com). Only 2,048 of these Mustangs were built and came equipped with a 355 HP, 427 cubic inch police interceptor engine, rear spoiler, rocker stripes, grill mounted headlights, fiberglass hood with hood scoop, longer nose, and roll bar and shoulder harness in the interior. ## 2014 Mustangs Across America 50<sup>th</sup> Drive

Want to get away next year? Looking for 2014 vacation ideas? How about participating in the Mustangs Across America 50<sup>th</sup> drive in April next year? *Mustang Monthly* reports that the Mustangs Across America organization is “pulling out all the stops” in planning the April 14, 2014 event, calling it the drive of a life time. The drive is open to all Mustangs. One of our RMCC members, Gary Wittmuss, took the drive in April, 2009 and has the following to say about the driving event:

Dottie and I, along with a few other RMCC members, attended the 45th anniversary drive in April 2009. After a guided tour and kick-off party at the Shelby Factory, we departed Las Vegas for Birmingham Alabama. Detailed maps of the route, along with morning briefings, were provided by the organizers. One could either stay with the convoy or venture off on your own. After getting on Interstate 40 at Kingman, we had the choice to stay on the super slab or to divert off onto Route 66 where it still existed, which we did. During each day's drive, we were provided with ample time to stop at points of interest such as "Standing on the corner in Winslow Arizona" or visiting the Route 66 museum in Clinton, Oklahoma. Waking up at the Super8 Motel in Santa Rosa NM and seeing the parking lot overflowing with Mustangs was quite a sight to behold. We met people from Canada, Australia, and Germany and hoisted a couple brews with a fun group from Denmark. In Amarillo, the local Ford dealer and the Mid-Texas Mustang Club provided lunch. At Mustang, Oklahoma the local Mustang Club provided a large park with a Bar-B-Q Bash and live western entertainment. Hundreds of Mustangs surrounded the park with the huge letters on the Mustang town water tank in the background.. These events were typical of the drive.

Our '02 GT Convert performed flawlessly and our trip was trouble free but in the Saleen of Mr. and Mrs. Dave Ramsey, things got to be a little more exciting as on one occasion he was forced onto the shoulder of the interstate in a shower of gravel, and in another incident he approached a freeway exit in a speedy manner, lost control, and gracefully spun out. All was well after a minor front end repaint of their car upon their return to Reno.

Looking forward to the 2014 drive, Dottie and I paid our entry fee of \$99.99 a couple weeks ago and as of May 20, the car count was at 223. While reserving motel rooms, a couple lower price motel chains, especially in Midland Texas, were already booked up. I do not know if the No Vacancies were due to MAA participants booking early or if the MAA were reserving blocks of rooms of which they will provide reduced rates later.

The 50<sup>th</sup> MAA drive will be following an all new 2,400 mile route. The seven day drive will originate in Los Angeles and end in Charlotte for a 50<sup>th</sup> Mustang birthday celebration. Planned stops along the route include Phoenix, Arizona; Las Cruces, New Mexico; Midland, Texas; Jackson, Mississippi; and Atlanta, Georgia. In addition to the planned stops, tours, and events participants will also be able to make their own stops and side trips. Nearly 150 Mustang owners have pre-registered, MAA organizers expect at least 500 Mustangs to make the drive. 
