## A History of the RMCC

This article is a compilation of Club events and decisions taken from the file of RMCC monthly minutes. Hopefully, it will provide information to those interested in the history of our club.

January 8, 1982: The Club was formed under the name “Reno Sierra Mustang Club” whose mission was to promote, operate and maintain the classic Mustang, 1964 ½ thru 1973. Initially the Club was affiliated with the Sierra Mustang Club in Sacramento. Our current president, Ron Wheeler, is a charter member of the original organization. Ron’s early contributions to the group were in the capacity of technical advisor and later as Car Show Chief Judge.

November, 1982: A decision was made to join the Mustang Club of America.

May 30 thru June 1, 1986: The Club held its first car show at the Peppermill Hotel/Casino. The show was named “Reno Stampede ‘86.”

February 4, 1988: Club members are encouraged to join the Mustang Club of America, but don’t have to.

January 1, 1989: RMCC broke off its affiliation with the Sacramento club and changed its name to the “Reno Mustang Car Club.”

The Club donated to the following charities in the 1980’s: Make a Wish, Police Widow’s and Orphan’s Fund, and the Veterans Memorial School for the Hearing Impaired.

December 1990: Our first participation in the Sparks Hometown Christmas parade with nine cars attending.

January 9, 1992: A lengthy discussion was held to open the Club to all Mustangs. The majority agreed to open the Club up to increased membership. It was decided to put the issue on a future ballot in the Club newsletter. (This did not happen until 13 years later).

August 11, 1992: The Membership Chairman reported a membership count of 111. She also explained that members now get points for activities attended. Winners get a plaque and one year free dues.

April 10, 1994: Date of the first “Mustang Rocking Street Hop.” All cars were welcomed for an entry fee of \$5. Music was by Hank LaDuke. The Club made a profit of \$58.00. Later street hops cost \$10, attracted as many as 154 cars and garnered as much as \$1,720 profit.

April 9, 1996: It was moved and approved that the RMCC would become a member of the National Auto Museum and to adopt a 1964 Ford Custom Daytona Coupe. A month later we agreed to adopt the ’65 Mustang.

June 8, 1999: Dave Beets of Hot August Nights asked for assistance with HAN traffic control. This was later approved by the Club.

During the 1990's the Club donated to the following charities: Roy Gomm Elementary School, DARE, Carson City Search & Rescue, Community Emergency Food Services, Willow Springs Children's Hospital, the Ronald McDonald House, Care Chest, Committee to Aid Abused Women, Kruising for Kids, the Washoe County Children in Transition Group, Salvation Army Angels Tree and various individuals who asked for help.

March 13, 2001: A RMCC Web page was developed.

August 14, 2001: It was approved to have Diamonds Auto Body paint the '65 Mustang at the National Auto Museum.

October 5, 2002: During the annual Reno Chili Cook Off, RMCC members had a chance to park their Mustangs on 4<sup>th</sup> Street. During this event, Carroll Shelby met with members, agreed to a photo op and signed member's cars.

August 2004: The first "Mustangs on the Green" at A&W.

February 8, 2005: A by-law change allows full membership status to owners of all Mustangs including holding office.

September 11, 2007: It was approved to combine Street Hop and Stampede into one yearly car show.

January 13, 2009: members voted to begin the process to rejoin Mustang Club of America. Ron Wheeler will be the contact with MCA.

July 14, 2009: The by-laws were amended to change Street Hop and Stampede to "Restomods in Reno."

June 7-9, 2013: RMCC was host to a National MCA show at Boomtown Hotel and Casino.

RMCC supported the following charities from 2000 to present: Kruising for Kids, Committee to Aid Abused Women, MDA Charity, Evelyn Mount, Food Bank of Northern Nevada, Children in Transition, the Humane Society, ComputerCorps to benefit Sierra Vista Elementary School, Vaughn Middle School, the Veteran's Guest House, and Wounded Warriors.

## Welcome Scott and Amy French

Two of the newest members of the RMCC are Scott and Amy French. The French's are proud owners of a 2001 Mustang Cobra, mineral grey with a grey and parchment interior, 4.6 Liter engine and 5-speed manual transmission; car number 2201 of 3,867 built that year. The couple moved to the Reno area three years ago and were interested in getting together with other Mustang enthusiasts to meet new people as well as view their cars. They found the RMCC while searching the Internet and landed on our Web site.



The family Mustang has an interesting story. After many years relying on his Harley Davidson motorcycle as his primary means of transportation, Scott felt that he needed something that offered a little more warmth in the winter. Given that he grew up in a family of Mustang owners and always had a passion for them, Scott started searching for a rare Mustang. In February what he found was a 2001 Mustang Cobra with 1,384 original miles on it up in Colorado! Scott jumped at the opportunity to buy it. Today the Mustang still has only a little over 4,000 miles on the odometer.

Scott has a very interesting vocation. After years of publishing experience with a daily newspaper in Texas, he went on to create his own holistic health magazine and built it up to over a 20,000 circulation. Scott went on to sell the magazine to a local doctor. Scott spent much of his life studying martial arts, achieving a 3<sup>rd</sup> degree black belt, becoming an instructor, and building his own martial arts business franchise. Scott sold his business to accompany his wife in a transfer to Reno. Scott is also an artist whose medium is wood burning – otherwise known as pyrography. He has now converted what started as a hobby into a business – The Burn Shop. Amy Gaspardino French is a successful business executive. Everyone attending the event agreed that the clutch was a great success and something that we should continue to do. So be it. If you have suggestions for future coffee clutch locations, please let me know.

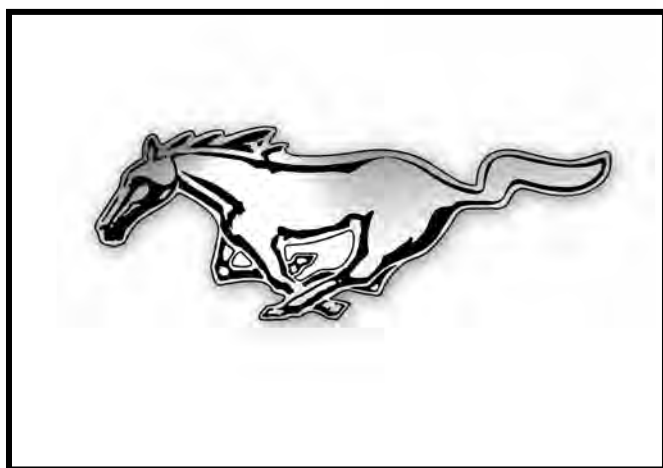


## History of the Mustang Logo
